Title Grounds for Suspension/Expulsion

The principal may suspend or recommend expulsion of a student who engages in one or more of the following activities while in or on school property. This includes, but is not limited to, all buildings used for instruction, administration, support services, maintenance, or storage, the grounds surrounding those buildings if the school is authorized to exercise dominion and control over those grounds, all vehicles used by the school for transporting students, workers, visitors, or other persons, or during a school sponsored activity. Students shall not be expelled if the conduct is a manifestation of the child's disability. In circumstances when administration believes a crime has been committed by a student, law enforcement shall be contacted.

When considering appropriate disciplinary consequences, the school shall consider:

- 1. The age of the student;
- 2. The discipline history of the student;
- 3. Whether the student has a disability;
- 4. The seriousness of the violation;
- 5. Whether the violation threatened the safety of any student or staff member; and
- 6. Whether lesser interventions would properly address the violation.

The following may be grounds for suspension or expulsion from a public school:

10	Continued willful disobedience or open and persistent defiance of proper authority, including deliberate refusal to obey a member of the school staff or the use of obscene or profane language or gestures to a member of the staff.
20	Willful destruction or defacement of school property.
25	Possessing or using any explosive or incendiary device, possessing a component of such a device, setting fire to or burning, or attempting to set fire to or burn any person or thing.
30	Behavior on property which is detrimental to the welfare or safety of other students or of school personnel including behavior which creates a threat of physical harm to the child or other children.
35	Behavior off school property which is detrimental to the welfare or safety of other students or of school personnel including behavior which creates a threat of physical harm to the child or other children.
40	Repeated interference with the school's ability to provide educational opportunities to other students.
60	Assault upon a teacher or school employee. A minimum of three days suspension is mandatory. For first and second degree assault see #410.

	Carrying, bringing, using, or possessing any weapon, including any knife,

300	Gang-related activity. Law enforcement shall be contacted when any known

	Any student who brings or possesses a dangerous weapon with intent to
455	threaten, intimidate, or cause physical or emotional harm shall be expelled for each and every offense.
460	Possession of a firearm, whether loaded or unloaded shall result in a one year expulsion, per federal law, unless the superintendent modifies this requirement for a student on a case-by-case basis. Such modifications must be in writing.
